8. **Catford Development Plan:** merely mentions ASL's as Ok. No other real commitment to facilitate cycling. Tim to respond to council **ACTION Tim**
9. **Convoys Wharf** need to ensure not too many car spaces. Permeability looks good, but the area cannot sustain a massive influx of cars. Monitor progress.
